

Southern Curriculum 2 successfully completed

Through team spirit to the grand final

When a group of dentists meets regularly over a period of months, discussing cases together, reflecting on surgical procedures, learning from one another and sharing a laugh, something emerges that goes far beyond traditional learning within a curriculum. The BDIZ EDI's second Southern Curriculum has ended in Ansbach with happy and successful graduates. Curriculum 3 will start in September 2026.

Team spirit not only characterised the conclusion of the BDIZ EDI Southern Curriculum but was evident throughout the entire programme. The eight-module course, designed and delivered by Dr Dr Markus Tröltzsch, focused on practical relevance, interaction and collegial exchange.

The Southern Curriculum represents an approach that rethinks traditional knowledge transfer. Instead of lectures, the programme focuses on hands-on sessions, case studies, live demonstrations and structured peer-to-peer learning opportunities. Participants are not merely listeners, but active shapers of their own learning process.

Thanks to modern teaching methods, knowledge is conveyed in a modular, visual and interactive way; the practical exercises, supported by various systems, provide hands-on experience—from models to clinical decision-making; and the group-based learning formats demonstrate that learning can function as a social process rather than a solitary endeavour. This learning culture creates an atmosphere in which questions are welcome and uncertainties are shared.

A group that has grown close together

What made this course programme special was the dynamic of the group. Different professional backgrounds, varying levels of experience—and yet a shared goal: to work with greater confidence, assurance and structure in the field of implantology.

A team spirit developed early on that carried the whole course forward—mutual support with complex cases and controversial yet constructive discussions. There was plenty of laughter—including at our own learning curves—and, ultimately, we celebrated our progress together, marking the first step towards our future as dentists specialising in implantology.

The closing ceremony reflected exactly that: a cheerful atmosphere, mutual appreciation and the realisation that each of us had grown—both professionally and personally.

The final day of the course was more than just the final exam and the formal presentation of certificates. It was a moment to reflect: what have we learnt? What surprised us? What will we take with us into our day-to-day practice?

The participants' responses demonstrated just how effective the curriculum had been: greater confidence in implant

planning and execution, a more structured approach to decision-making, greater clarity regarding risks and alternatives, patient-centred communication and, above all, confirmation of their own professional development.

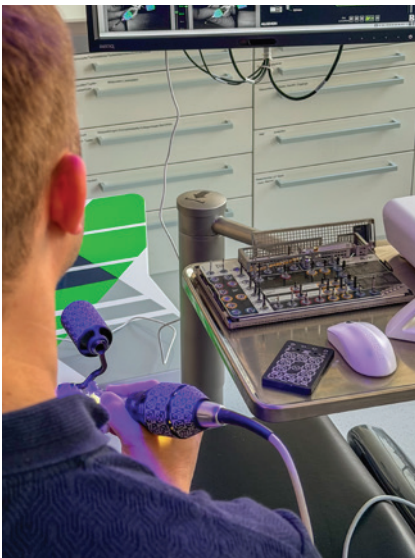
